

As someone who has had a small goat herd for two years now (heading into my second kidding season), I can't recommend this book highly enough for both newbies and more experienced goatherds. Prior to getting our first goats, my partner and I read probably every book on raising goats available in our local library. They all contained good information, but I wasn't completely satisfied with any one of them. This is the book I was looking for. "Raising Goats for Dummies" is easy to read and (more importantly) easy to navigate. The formatting makes it easy to flip to the sections you need or to locate important tips in a hurry. The author has covered every aspect of basic goat husbandry for the urban and rural dweller alike, from the very beginning aspects of selecting and purchasing goats, preparing for the new arrivals and basic routine feeding and care, to more specialized information on breeding and kidding, milking, raising goats for fiber or meat, and

common health issues to look out for. Though I wish we would've had this book when we started our goat adventure, it's still a valuable part our farm's reference library. Earlier today, for example, I reviewed the sections on "Getting Ready for Kidding," "Grasping the Basics of Kidding," and "Taking Care of Mother and Kids after Kidding," in preparation for our doe's upcoming birth. I can see myself referring to this book often over time, as our goats present us with new situations. We also own the author's other book, "Goat Health Care"--the two books complement each other well, and are our first go-to books when we have any questions or concerns about our goats. This book is BRILLIANT. It is easy to use, the author writes in very 'lay-person' terms, whilst educating and informing at the same time. The style of the book is set up so that each chapter can be flicked to if you just want to check a particular point or make reference quickly to something specific. I have only had it a few days and I have already been through it several times. I have learnt a lot of 'how tos' which I was having trouble finding in other books and publications I've read. This is truly a bible for those who are first time goat owners, but it will also come in handy for any experienced goat owner. The diagrams are simple and quite charming and the author's writing style is friendly and approachable and not at all condescending as some other 'how to' style books can be. This book is a gem and a must have - if you are a goat owner, get it on your bookshelf, you will use it all the time and be glad you have it. I give it a big thumbs up.

As with many of the books in the Dummies series, this book is very well written, comprehensive, and offers a wealth of advice for beginners. I'm still trying to decide whether to get a goat, and this book is exactly what I was looking for.
